Maternity and Care

with professor Inge van Nistelrooij and (as a guest lecturer) professor Merel Visse

After that, fully online. You will study societal ideas about care and maternity in the context of neoliberalism. These ideas involve practices of mothering, ideologies of motherhood, and ideas on the relational character of caring and maternal selves. We explore the absence and / or marginalization of care and maternity in thought, representation, and imagination.

On Narrative Inquiry

with professor Gaetana Kopchinsky and with guest lecturer professor Richard Morehouse.



The clinical narrative becomes a practical exercise integrating advanced narrative, bioethics, and observational skills to create illness ethnographies. Students will have an opportunity to learn the tools of qualitative, psycho-social research, behavioral profiling, and introspective analysis to capture and analyze narrative themes. These themes reflect patient experiences and perspectives and connect them with institutional and societal themes.

Identifies the difference and convergence among care ethics and other approaches to ethics, in particular biomedical ethics. Examines what constitutes “good care” through care ethical concepts (such as vulnerability, precariousness, dependency, power, responsibility) and relates these concepts to everyday experiences from health care practices by analyzing case examples through a dialectic approach that is both critical and creative.

with professor Erin Sheehan

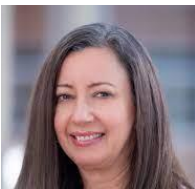
