# Tiphannie Yanique



Tiphannie Yanique is a novelist, poet, essayist, and short story writer. Her poetry collection, *Wife*, won the 2016 Bocas Prize in Caribbean poetry and the UK's Forward/Felix Dennis Prize. Her novel, *Land of Love and Drowning*, one of NPR's Best Books of 2014, won The Center for Fiction's First Novel Prize and the Phillis Wheatley Award for Pan-African Literature. She's also the author of the short story collection, *How to Escape from a Leper Colony*, which earned her a listing as one of the National Book Foundation's 5Under35. Tiphannie's work has appeared in the *New York Times*, *Best African American Fiction*, and *Best American Short Stories*. Her highly anticipated second novel, *Monster in the Middle*, will be published in October 2021. She hails from the Virgin Islands and lives with her family in Atlanta, where she teaches at Emory University.
