First Destinations: Overview

A knowledge rate of 81.4% (272 outcomes/334 graduates) was achieved for the Class of 2022. According to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE), the national knowledge rate of the class of 2021 (the most recent year they have collected data) for schools with student enrollment under 2000, was 76.1%

90.44% of the class of 2022 were working or enrolled in a program of continuing education. According to NACE, the national data for schools with student enrollment under 2000 who were working or enrolled in continuing education for the class of '21 was 80.1%

Continuing Education: Institutions

On average, 30.15%* of Drew graduates elect to continue their education after graduation. The national data for the class of 2021 for schools with enrollment under 2000 is 19.8%. (*Some respondents that indicated continuing education did not provide their degree type.)
